RTSP

Overview

Students enrolled in the Supported Return to School Program (SRSP) have demonstrated their capacity to engage with the learning tasks and self-regulate their behaviour in a positive manner.

As new students have enrolled in the program and others students have returned to their home school the social dynamics of the student cohort has remained harmonious and cooperative. Our parents and caregivers have provided SRSP staff with encouraging feedback on the positive attributes of the program as they relate to their children and children in care.

Literacy

Students engaged in topics focusing on world events in history that have shaped the way we live today. Terrorism 9/11 and Remembrance day. We use the online program Mathletics to engage students in their mathematics.
